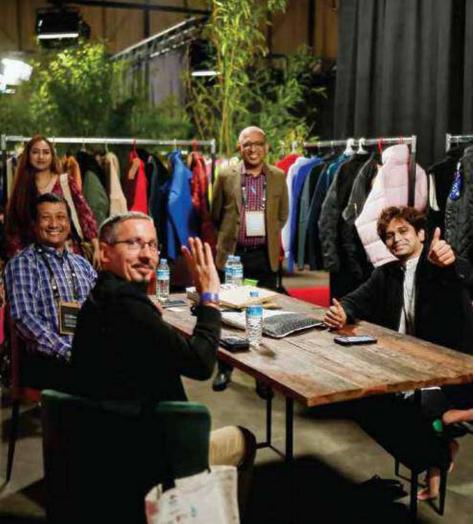

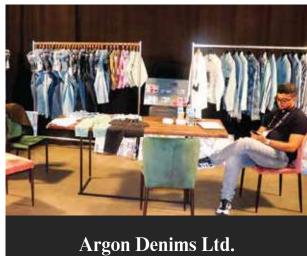

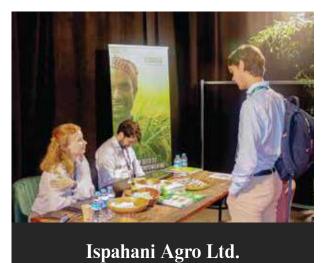

Bangladesh - Perspectives from An Emerging Economy

Overview:

Over the past decade, Bangladesh has notable economic undergone transformation. GDP grew at over 6% annually, for a decade and a half. Bangladesh quietly transitioned from a long-known agrarian economy to a significant manufacturing and services hub in South Asia catalysed by rapid infrastructure urbanization and development. Yet, Bangladesh faces certain developmental challenges that ought to be addressed to sustain its further economic progress.

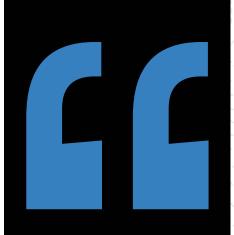

Panel Session 03

Empowering the Future: Advancing Safety & Well-being for Garments Workforce in Bangladesh

Overview:

Bangladesh's apparel industry employs 4+ million workers, playing a crucial role in the country's economic and social development. Apparel exports from Bangladesh reached \$45 billion (2022), accounting for 80+% of total merchandised exports. However, serious concerns dominate workers' rights, safety standards, wages, and well-being in the industry. As the world's second-largest apparel exporting nation, the Bangladesh industry is expected to incrementally elevate the conditions, especially when three-fourths of its employed workforce are women.are women.





Discussion Summary:

Empowering the Future: Advancing Safety & Well-being for Garments Workforce in Bangladesh

Collaboration among government, manufacturers, brands and development partners is crucial for implementing policies and programs that empower the workforce through upskilling, increased income security, workplace safety nets, and representation. The panel discussed the pragmatic steps that Bangladesh ought to take to ensure the four million empowered garment workforce powering its largest export industry can work in decent and safe conditions.

Panel Session 04

Bangladesh Agro-Food: A Next Opportunity for Collaboration

Overview:

Bangladesh agriculture employs 40+% of the total labor force and contributes around 13% to GDP. However, productivity lags behind the regional peers due to infrastructure gaps, climate change unpredictability risks, lack of R&D investments, and high post-harvest losses (estimated at US\$ 4+ billion annually). The agro-food processing industry in Bangladesh, which is still at a nascent stage, holds considerable promise given the country's agro-ecology, natural resources, and demographics.





Discussion Summary:

Bangladesh Agro-Food: A Next Opportunity for Collaboration

The panel discussed the strategies to develop Bangladesh's high-potential agro-food value chain through partnerships between the government, private sector, development agencies, agricultural producers, and SMEs. By facilitating dialogue across stakeholders, the session aimed to identify collaborative initiatives that can unlock the immense potential of Bangladesh's agro-food sector to enhance farmer livelihoods, food security, employment generation, and sustainable economic growth.

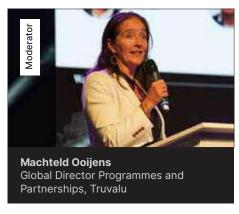

Panel Session 05

Impact Investing - The Next Frontier

Overview:

Impact investing holds potential in Bangladesh by channeling innovative (private) capital in bringing positive social and environmental change while also generating financial returns. The global impact investing market has seen tremendous growth, with assets projected to reach US\$ 1.5 trillion, by 2030. However, major gaps remain around product development, policy incentives, impact measurement, and investor awareness. The sector's small deal sizes, limited exits, and high due diligence costs also pose challenges.





Discussion Summary:

Impact Investing -The Next Frontier

The panel discussed strategies to accelerate the momentum in Bangladesh's impact investing industry; and highlighted the impact of diverse stakeholders to foster the emergence of commercially viable, high-impact enterprises, and enable catalytic capital to flow at scale into priority sectors aligned with sustainable development. It holds promise given the younger demography, start-up scene, urbanization, and digitalization in Bangladesh.



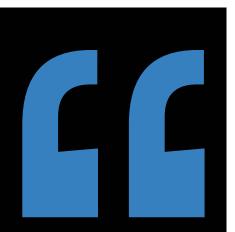

Panel Session 06

Sustainable Synergy: Circular Economy, Climate Action & Bangladesh's Future

Overview:

Bangladesh, home to 165+ million people, faces significant climate-induced risks stemming from its vulnerability to natural disasters, rising sea levels and various climatic stress. Bangladesh's annual economic loss from climate change impacts is estimated at 2% of GDP/annum which is projected to escalate. At the same time, the imperative for rapid economic development, as a lower-Middle Income Country, also presents challenges on account of sustainability.





Discussion Summary:

Sustainable Synergy: Circular Economy, Climate Action & Bangladesh's Future

The panel brought up discussion amongst stakeholders on low-carbon, resource-efficient circular models/solutions for Bangladesh across sectors e.g. energy, infrastructure, transportation, manufacturing, and food systems. Several questions also surfaced in terms of how best to advance entrepreneurship as the global norms and practices in supply chains continue to change. The panel discussed joint efforts by government, businesses, NGOs and communities to enhance climate resilience & boost economic, social & environmental outcomes.

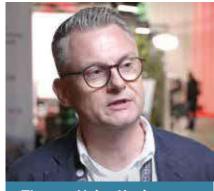

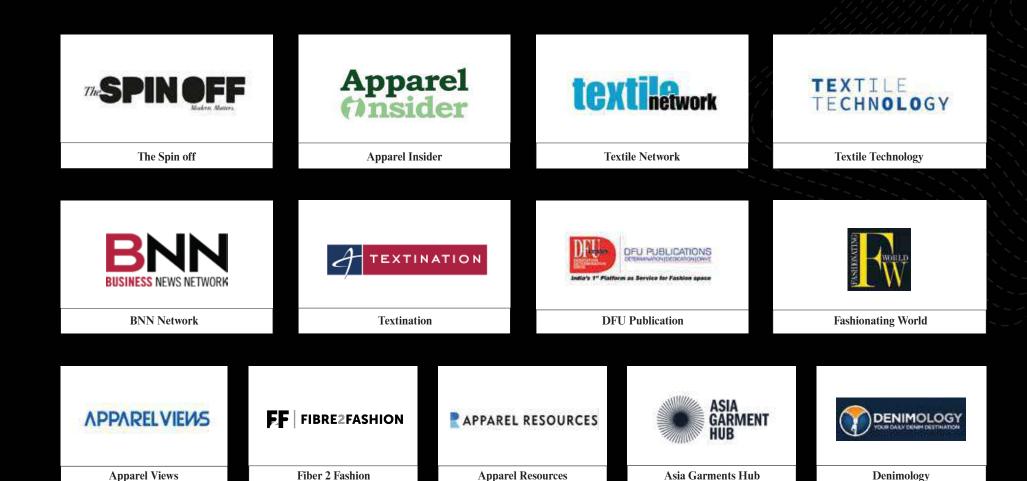

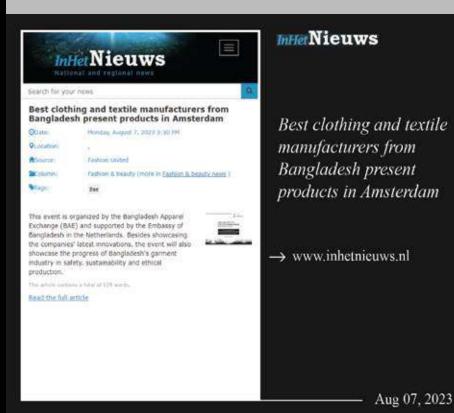
